



Based on the current data, here is a possible course of action to address this part of the growth related to VinFast/FedEx anticipated impact on Chatham Park's Northern Village and Southern Village. These needs will be reassessed in January of 2023 after OREd completes a full Land Use Study and gives us updated student population projections which will include the VinFast/FedEx impact on other developments in the Moncure area and the rest of the county. In addition, this study will include evaluating the impending economic development in the western part of the county.

New Elementary School in Chatham Park Northern Village

- A Chatham Park site has tentatively been identified and will need to be finalized/committed to per existing MOU
- Design to start in 2024-2025 and to open for students in the fall of 2027-2028
- Capacity to be determined and will be based on developing student projections
- This school will relieve the projected overcrowding at Perry
 Harrison Elementary and will provide needed classroom capacity for
 both Chatham Park and Perry Harrison/Chatham Grove
 PreK-5 students

George Moses Horton Middle School

- Central Services South needs to be converted back to classrooms
- Design to start in 2026-2027 and open for students in the fall of 2028-2029

Northwood High School

- No changes anticipated at this time
- The school has sufficient capacity already in place needed through the year 10 projections



New Elementary School in Chatham Park Southern Village

- A Chatham Park site will need to be identified and finalized/committed to per existing MOU
- Design to start in 2024-2025 and open for students in the fall of 2027-2028
- Capacity to be determined and will be based on developing student projections
- This school will be sized to address the projected Chatham Park Southern Village elementary student needs, and to serve as temporary "swing space" to facilitate the possible demo and reconstruction of the current Moncure (K-8) School

Rebuilt Moncure (K-8) School

- A Feasibility Study will need to be completed to establish the viability of demoing the existing school and building a new K-8 school on the same site
- Design to begin in 2026-2027 and open for students in the fall of 2029-2020
- Rebuilt school would be sized to address the projected non-Chatham Park K-8 student population and the projected Chatham Park Southern Village 6-8 student population, as impacted by VinFast/FedEx
- Proposed Chatham Park Southern Village Elementary School could serve as "swing space" during demo/construction period

Seaforth High School

- No changes anticipated at this time
- The school has sufficient capacity already in place needed through the year 10 projections


Chatham Grove Elementary

- Current OREd student population projections indicate a need to consider redistricting part of the CGE student population to address possible overcrowding due to unanticipated levels of student growth
- Determination of possible next steps will be done in collaboration with OREd and would include public input

Margaret Pollard Middle School

- Current OREd projections indicate an immediate need to create additional classroom space to address overcrowding due to unanticipated levels of student growth
- Design to begin in 2022-2023 and open for students in 2024-2025
- Administrative proposal is to construct brick and mortar additions to two of the three wings and add eight classrooms
- These new classrooms will create a serviceable capacity of 1,100 students needed through the 10 year projections
